




DISTRICT ENROLLMENT SINCE 1942-43



RACIAL/ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF STUDENTS SINCE 1990-91




**END OF FIRST QUARTER MEMBERSHIP




RACIAL/ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF STUDENTS 2017-18 THROUGH 2021-22




GRADE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS 2021-22








District Membership Daily Counts Throughout Year 2021-22





This graph shows the daily membership for the district through the end of the school year. The district's peak enrollment for the school year occurred on December 2, 2021, with 32,447 students enrolled.




2021-22**




**DISCIPLINE INCIDENTS BY INFRACTIONS
2021-22**







2017-18 THROUGH 2021-22**






General Fund Revenue per Student (ADM) - \$12,499

The Oklahoma City Public Schools Foundation’s mission is to advance excellence, advocate for equity, and build strong community support for Oklahoma City Public Schools.

Focus Areas and Strategic Alignment

The Foundation’s focus areas are a result of partnership and alignment with OKCPS and the community. See below for our focus areas and programs/initiatives that support Oklahoma City Public Schools:

Focus #1: Provide Innovative Teacher/Classroom/School Support

DonorsChoose

- Through a partnership with DonorsChoose and with the assistance from generous community partners, the Foundation provides funding for classroom projects posted on DonorsChoose by OKCPS teachers.
- Recent studies show that having a project funded through DonorsChoose makes a teacher 22% less likely to leave in a given school year.

Partners in Action

The Partners in Action initiative allows principals to post projects that are matched with community partners to fulfill, including time, talent and treasure. Combined financial impact for DonorsChoose and Partners in Action in the 2021-2022 School Year was more than \$2.7 million.

- The Foundation provides support for principal-led/community supported school-wide needs including but not limited to:
 - Coat-A-Kid
 - Kit-A-Kid
 - Incentives to Improve Attendance District-Wide
 - STEM Centers/STEM Education Support

ReadOKC

- The Foundation leads the efforts of ReadOKC, the literacy initiative of the district to instill the love of reading in our students and community. These efforts include three primary goals:
 - **Increasing access** to reading materials through Little Libraries installed outside of every school, and through the ReadOKC On the Go! Mobile Book Bus that visits all schools and provides brand new books for students.
 - **Host Reading Challenges** during every school break and provide prizes and incentives to encourage students to read at least 20 minutes per day.
 - **Recruit volunteers to serve as Reading Buddies** to create a lasting relationship with students and help them establish a love of reading.

Focus #2: Lead Efforts to Recruit and Retain Urban-Ready Teachers and Leaders

- The Foundation, with the assistance of donors and education partners at the University of Central Oklahoma, OSU-OKC, OKC Community College and Rose State College, facilitates four programs that “Grow our Own” teachers and leaders who are bilingual and of color. The programs provide funding for tuition, fees and books for paraprofessionals, high school graduates and teachers who are bilingual or of color to become certified teachers and leaders for OKCPS. To date we have 13 graduates of the Teacher Pipeline Programs and 59 participants.
 - High School to Teacher Pipeline Program
 - Bilingual Teacher Pipeline Program
 - Diversity Teacher Pipeline Program
 - Aspiring Administrator Pipeline Program

Focus #3: Build Advocates for OKCPS

- The Foundation builds advocates for OKCPS by forming partnerships with state and local leaders to share success stories and priorities for district-wide issues and funding needs.
- The Foundation also hosts events that bring the community awareness of the challenges, needs and successes. These events include:
 - Wall of Fame Humanitarian Awards
 - Celebrates the long, rich history of Oklahoma City Public Schools by inducting some of the city and nation's most influential business, community and artistic leaders who are OKCPS graduates into the Wall of Fame.
 - Stars of Education
 - The Stars of Education event is when the annual OKCPS District Teacher of the Year is announced and also recognizes members of the OKCPS community who demonstrate exceptional teaching, inspired service and volunteerism within the district. The Foundation provides recognition and cash awards for the Teacher of the Year and finalists, exceptional support staff within the district, and valuable volunteers and community partners who make a difference daily. Additionally, The Sam and Charolet Shirley Principal of the Year Award is presented to one Elementary and one Secondary principal who also receive a cash prize as part of this award.
 - T-Up for OKCPS
 - T-Up for OKCPS is a day for the community to show their support and solidarity for OKCPS simply by purchasing an "OKCPS Champion" t-shirt and wearing it to celebrate Stars of Education. This campaign raises funds and awareness for the needs of Oklahoma City Public Schools by supporting the impactful work of the Oklahoma City Public Schools Foundation.

GREAT EXPECTATIONS	Great Expectations is an eclectic approach to teaching that emphasizes the behavioral component of classroom instruction.
HEAD START	Head Start is a comprehensive child development program which serves children from birth to age five, pregnant women, and their families. The goal is to increase school readiness of young children in low-income families.
HEALTHY SCHOOLS OK	This program focuses on injury prevention, cardiovascular disease prevention, cancer control, and physical fitness.
JROTC	JROTC is a high school program where military courses are given during regular school hours in addition to many out-of-classroom activities. Students learn the basics in military history, government, technology awareness, and current events. The main focus is on developing leadership skills as well as how to study, take tests, interview for jobs, and learn first aid skills.
JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT	Junior Achievement teaches students how they can impact the world around them as individuals, workers, and consumers. This program prepares students for future economic and workforce issues they will face.
JUNIOR BOTBALL	Interactive program developed to teach STEM fundamentals and help students of all levels achieve subject mastery through hands on robotic activities.
KENNEDY CENTER PARTNERS IN EDUCATION	Schools develop a vision and long-range plan for arts integration, select from various introductory and in-depth professional learning options, and receive technical assistance from more experienced schools and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.
LINK CREW	A high school transition program that welcomes freshmen and makes them feel comfortable throughout the first year of high school. Mentors from the senior and junior classes guide the freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful.
PBIS	Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture needed for all students in a school to achieve social, emotional and academic success.
STRIVING READERS	Addresses the literacy needs and improves the learning outcomes of children from birth through Grade 12 using clear content standards in the areas of pre-literacy, reading, and writing.
SUMMIT PERSONALIZED LEARNING	Enables teachers to customize instruction for individual student needs while students become self-directed learners and develop habits to help them succeed with continuing education, career, and life.


